



Manny team aiming big for cancer funds

➔ TEAM Manny Moo Moo, which raised the highest amount of money at the 2013 Penrith Relay for Life, will attempt to collect more money at the 2014 event to help fight against cancer.

Team co-ordinator Sharon Degeling, of Mulgoa, believes they can collect more than last year with her son Emmanuel (Manny) Degeling, as their chief mascot.

Emmanuel, 20 months, is recovering from cancer. When only six months old he had been diagnosed with hepatoblastoma – a tumour on his liver.

"Last year we raised \$20,000 and this year we hope to raise more to help with the fight against cancer," Mrs Degeling said. "We will start off with a charity ball on Friday, February 14, at the Conca D'oro, Riverwood.

"We have our cow suits ready and we have bought a few more for new members who join the team.

"Manny has a new cow suit made up for him and he's doing well and is a happy and energetic two-year-old."
